Sonoma Water Government Affairs Report - October 7, 2024

Federal Priorities Survey

ACWA's Federal Relations team is introducing a pilot initiative to more closely formulate ACWA's federal priorities. Specifically, a survey will request information regarding issues, funding, and agency relations, among other things, important to ACWA members. The survey will open on October 15 and a link to complete the survey will be circulated to voting members of the Federal Affairs Committee on this date. The deadline to complete the survey and record results is November 15. If you are not a voting member of the Federal Affairs Committee but would still like to have your perspective considered you can speak with your regional rep to the Committee, reach out to Ian (ianl@acwa.com) and Caleb (calebr@acwa.com) in the ACWA DC office, or attend the next Federal Affairs Committee meeting scheduled for December 3rd during ACWA's Fall Conference.

A PDF of the draft survey is attached. Please note this is not a solicitation for survey responses. We are sharing the survey for information purposes as we request your input before the survey launches. Questions about the survey we would like you to consider include: Is there an issue that is important to you that is not represented in the survey? Are the questions clear? Are there items that should be added or removed from the survey? Please share this survey with your ACWA network and let us know of any feedback by October 11.

Results of the survey will be presented and discussed during ACWA's next Federal Affairs meeting scheduled for December 3rd at ACWA's Fall Conference and Expo. Survey results will not solely determine ACWA's priorities but will provide important information and help guide ACWA and the Federal Affairs Committee as it works to develop federal priorities for 2025.

U.S. EPA regulations under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA)

ACWA's Federal Relations team is putting together a workgroup to comment on U.S. Environmental Protection Agency regulations under TSCA for vinyl chloride and DINP, which are both used in the manufacture of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) pipe. The workgroup meeting will take place on October 7 at 11:00am Pacific. If you are interested in participating in this workgroup, please let us know by October 6 and we will send you a meeting invite link. If you are unable to attend this meeting but would still like to provide input, please contact Caleb Raspler at calebr@acwa.com.

On 7/25/24, EPA released a proposal to <u>designate five chemical compounds as High-Priority Substances for risk evaluation pursuant to TSCA</u>. One of the compounds is vinyl chloride (CASRN 75-01-4). Vinyl chloride is used in the manufacture of PVC pipes which are often used for water supply. Comments are due on 10/23/24.

On 9/3/24, EPA <u>announced the availability of a draft risk evaluation</u> for di-isononyl phthalate (DINP) (1,2-Benzene- dicarboxylic acid, 1,2- diisononyl ester) (CASRN 28553-12-0). DINP is used as a plasticizer in PVC pipes which are often used for water supply. Comments are due on 11/4/24.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Environmental Justice Strategic Plan

ACWA <u>filed comments</u> on USACE's Draft Environmental Justice Strategic Plan following USACE's request for input. USACE stated its Plan will guide how it integrates environmental justice principles into its Civil Works programs. In its comments, ACWA expressed support for addressing environmental justice issues and noted the importance of balancing these efforts with the need to develop and maintain water infrastructure. Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on ACWA's draft comments.
