Mr. Ekdahl,

Term 11 of the State Board Order approving Sonoma Water’s Temporary Urgency Change Petition in the Matter of Permits 12947A, 12949, 12950, and 16596 (Applications 12919A, 15736, 15737, 19351) states that, “... Sonoma Water shall report on the status of implementation of its WSCP and the WSCPs of its contractors and other wholesale customers and the extent to which shortage levels comply with urban conservation regulations.”

The results of Sonoma Water’s 2022 Water Shortage Assessment Report submitted to DWR in June 2022 indicated that sufficient supply existed to meet unconstrained demands through June 2023, and consequently no action was required to activate Sonoma Water’s Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP) for this period.

Nonetheless, in consideration of the uncertainty of ongoing drought and to preserve water supplies, Sonoma Water continues to proactively implement demand reduction measures consistent with a Level 2 shortage response in compliance with statewide conservation regulations. This includes communication with our retail contractors and other wholesale customers to maintain regional consistency in our shortage response. The table below provides the status of WSCP implementation of our primary contractors and Marin Water. Although Marin Water is not currently implementing a shortage level of their WSCP, they have enacted year-round water waste and irrigation use restrictions that exceed the State requirements for a Level 2 response.

¹ City of Cotati is not subject to the California Water Code provisions of the Urban Water Management Planning Act based on the number of connections and annual volume of water sales.

In addition to the primary contractors, Sonoma Water has communicated its drought response with its other smaller wholesale customers, including Forestville Water District and California American Water-Larkfield, which continue to implement their respective shortage plans as detailed below:

- Forestville Water District
 - Implementing mandatory water restrictions and Phase 1-Voluntary conservation measures of its

Ordinance #16, and as amended by Ordinance #18.

- California American Water Company-Larkfield
 - Implementing CPUC Rule and Schedule 14.1 for a Stage 2 shortage and mandatory prohibitions of water waste.
- Kenwood Village Water Company
 - Notice to customers of Sonoma Water 20 percent shortage condition
- Penngrove Water Company
 - Notice to customers of Sonoma Water 20 percent shortage condition
- Lawndale Mutual Water Company
 - Notice to customers of Sonoma Water 20 percent shortage condition
